Patient volume decreased temporarily by 12% in 2020 due to COVID. Additionally, many patient visits were virtual through PPWI's statewide Virtual Care and PP Direct programs and not counted towards a specific health center location.

## Impact in Appleton

Planned Parenthood of Wisconsin provides affordable, quality, and confidential health care to 1,591 patients at our Appleton health center. In 2020, there were over 2,300 patient visits for health care services. Of the patients we served in Appleton, 39% lived below the federal poverty level, and at least 77% were Medicaid eligible. Planned Parenthood is the largest community based reproductive health care provider in Appleton.

**PPWI's Education Department provided 427 school and community education programs for over 10,000 participants in 2020. Program shifts due to COVID-19 included 1,527 phone calls to Latinx community members through PPWI's Promotores de Salud program and reaching 1,323 youth through Youth Health Educators' social media. PPWI provides education workshops in schools and community settings, home health parties, health fairs and other outreach events, and professional training opportunities.**
